A Little Piece of History...



The settlement of Atwood dates back to 1854. In the early days, the town was known as "Elma Centre" and "Newry Station". Settler John Binning Purcell was the first to arrive and create a permanent colonial settler residence in the area slightly to the north (now identified as Listowel). By 1866, the population of the area had increased to 800 and the settlement became an incorporated Village.

Access to the Kinsmen Trail. The Kinsmen Trail follows along the former railway rights of way adjacent to rural areas, and connects to Memorial Park through residential areas. The trail runs approximately 22km from Gowanstown to Hefryn through Listowel and Atwood. Visitors can enjoy walking, hiking, biking and cross country skiing.
